# CC&R REMINDERS

Short-term rentals (i.e., nightly or weekly rentals) are PROHIBITED by the Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions that govern Pinebrook Estates. Not only are short-term rentals a nuisance to neighbors and a threat to our property values, they are barred by and violate the Summit County ordinances governing the Hillside Stewardship Zone in which we live.

Please remember that newly installed outside lighting must comply with Summit County light ordinances. For the most part, that means fixtures must be fully shielded so that the light does not shine outside of your property. Also, shiny or reflective metal roofs are prohibited in all of Pinebrook. In addition, please remember that outside paint colors are limited to earth tones.

Some of our members are exploring solar lighting. That is great! Architectural Committee approval is required before proceeding with such an installation. Approval is also needed for new landscaping or re-contouring of land where the new grade will change by more than two feet. If you wonder whether you are affected, of if you just have questions, please ask.

#### EXTERIOR LIGHTS

One of the many things Pinebrook residents love about living up here in the mountains away from the urban sprawl is seeing the stars at night. As the Park City area continues to develop, light pollution from commercial and residential buildings is becoming more of a problem. One way to help remedy light pollution is to turn off home exterior lights or set them on timers when going to bed. We realize that safety is a concern and so here are some recommendations: Install light fixtures that illuminate downward, use lower wattage bulbs, or install motion sensor lights. Please be considerate of your neighbors, especially this time of year when windows and blinds are open so that we can enjoy the night sky and the cool mountain breezes, and not have to contend with bright lights.
